Ms. Hanfland has been involved with training teachers in brain friendly teaching techniques for over ten years. She has a B.S. in Education from Bradley University, a Masters in Educational Administration from Eastern Illinois University and has completed post graduate work in Leadership Development from the University of Illinois.

He was recently named the Illinois “teacher-preneur” of the year, and was also recently honored with a Leaders in Learning Award from the cable television industry.
